

Intergenerational programming creates reciprocal exchange rather than just making older adults into burdens / care recipients. It starts to weave older adults back into the fabric of everyday societal life









#### MOM'S CHILL BOWL


#### INGREDIENTS:

- · 1 lb ground beek · 1 tsp. dried basil

- 4. Garnish with cheese and serve with chips.








- Mobile dining hall & community hub that circulates in different neighborhoods
